ZACCHAEUS MEETS JESUS; LUKE 19:1-10

Luke 19:1-10

Zacchaeus was a sinner. v.2

- 1. Zacchaeus was short. Greek is mikros meaning "small" in stature.
- 2. Zacchaeus was extremely wealthy.
- The Jewish public would have considered Zacchaeus and any other tax collector the worst of sinners, a traitor. The religious establishment very likely had written him off.

Zacchaeus was a seeker. v.3-6

- 1. External evidence of his interest was obvious. He was eager. v.4
- 2. Internal evidence of his interest was also present. v.6

The Greek word is *chairon* meaning "rejoicing".

Jesus was a seeker too. v.3-6, 10

- 1. Jesus was a seeker of sinners. v.10
- Jesus began His journey toward Zacchaeus before Zachaeus was even born. Genesis 3:15
- 3. Zacchaeus may have sought Jesus, but it was Jesus who found Zacchaeus. v.5
- 4. Jesus seeks with purpose. v.10

Jesus required a response. v.8-9

- 1. Choices of the heart yield external evidence of fruit. v.8
- 2. In contrast, a very different response from the Rich Ruler in Luke 18:18-30
- 3. Jesus' practice of eating at the homes of sinners is marked by a change in the sinners, not in Jesus.

Jesus seeks us because He loves us. v.8-9

- 1. He loves us while we are still sinners. Romans 5:8
- 2. He promises those who seek Him, they will find Him. Jeremiah 29:13
- 3. There is no one beyond His grace. Acts 10:43; Romans 1:16

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. John 3:16
